

Dear Postal Customer:

Passport Book or Passport Card?

Passport Books can be used for ALL entry methods into an international country – whether air, land, or sea. **Passport Cards** are limited to travel through land and sea borders only.

VALIDITY

- Adult (16 years and older) is valid for 10 years
- Age 0-15 years (MINOR) us valid for 5 years

REQUIREMENTS:

You must apply in person if you can respond **YES** to at least one of the following statements:

- I am applying for my 1st US passport.
- I am applying with my child who is under age 16.
- My most recent US Passport was issued when I was under age 16.
- My most recent US passport was lost, stolen, or damaged.
- My most recent US passport was issued more than 15 years ago.

Please bring the following items to this post office to Apply for an Adult (16 years and older) **1st Time Passport (Book or Card)**.

What is NEEDED to apply:

- DS-11 Passport Application
- Evidence of Citizenship (Original Naturalization Certificate or Birth Certificate no abstract)
- Valid Driver's License or ID (Must not be expired)
- One Passport Photo
- \$35 Acceptance Fee (Payable to the **USPS** or **Postmaster**)
- Passport Fee Chart Below (Payable to The **Department of State**
 - For Minors under 16 DS -3053 Statement of Consent
 - For Minors under 16 DS 5525 Statement of Exigent/Special Family Circumstances

RENEWALS REQUIREMENTS - ONLINE Travel.state.gov

- Most recent Passport can be submitted with your DS-82 application
- Your Passport is not damaged (other than normal wear & tear)
- Your Passport has never been reported lost or stolen
- Your Passport was issued within the last 15 years
- Your Passport was issued when you were age 16 or older
- Your Passport was issued in your current name (or you can provide a document like a marriage certificate or divorce decree to show you have changed your name)

OPTIONAL FEES (Paid to the US Department of State)					
Expedite Fee	Paid per application, in addition to required fees. Provides faster processing than routine service.	\$60			
1-2 Day Delivery	Paid per application for 1-2 day delivery of an issued passport book from the Department of State to the customer. Only applies to mailing addresses within the United Stationes. Not valid for Passport Cards.	\$22.05			
File Search Fee	A file search is necessary when an applicant is unable to present evidence of US Citizenship or verification of a previously issued US Passport or Consular Report of Birth Abroad. Applicant must submit Form DS-11 and a written request for a file search.	\$150			

ADULT RENEWALS (16 Years and Older) You must apply by MAIL ONLY. Below are the fees for basic renewals. Optional fees may apply.

Adult Passport Book	DS-82	\$130
Adult Passport Card valid for international air travel. Valid only for trave by land and by sea to Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean.	DS-82	\$30
Adult Passport Book & Card	DS-82	\$ 160

Submitting incorrect passport fees could delay the Department of State in processing your application.
